
- . **How to cite DOI numbers** in order to allow the platform to create live links, the references should not only be complete and correct, but also written in the same way as already indexed in CrossRef. The CrossRef search box is a reliable source of information that allows for the complete screening of all of the scientific works that have DOI numbers registered. To ensure those references are correct, the best solution is to check how the article was indexed in CrossRef and copy exactly the same style. Please visit http://search.crossref.org/ in order to search for the article:
- In the search box insert the query (article title, DOI number, etc more examples can be found in "Help! Example Queries" below).
- On the list with results, find the article you are looking for. If CrossRef does not detect your article it is an indication that it is not available in the database (please remember that it takes CrossRef around 2 weeks to register newly published articles, they will not be searchable through the search box until that time).



• Once you have found the article you were looking for, click on the "Actions" button and then select "Cite" from the list. Another window will open, with different referencing styles to choose from. Copy the style that you need.
